The main challenge was to seat everybody in the right seat on time; punctuality is important at Royal Weddings. The way of working explained in this presentation is also of value outside the world of Royal Weddings. Jean Paul will explain how this method can be used at any large-scale event with VIP's. He and his Protocolbureau have successfully applied the same approach at many other events.
